

2022-2023 Mason Core Committee Report

2022-2023 Committee Activities

A Committee retreat was held on September 9th, 2022 to plan for the upcoming year. In addition, committee members reviewed criteria for evaluating Mason Core course proposals.

Regular Mason Core Committee meetings were held nine times during the 2022-2023 academic year.

Capstone/Synthesis Category Revision

The committee created a task force to strengthen the proposal to combine the current Capstone and Synthesis Mason Core category into one culminating experience category. The new category was created with clearly defined learning outcomes and new name – Mason Apex. The name was developed in conjunction with the Office of Student Involvement, who helped run focus groups with various student constituencies. The goal of these changes was to make the process for submitting courses to this category easier to navigate. Mason Core Committee members visited various colleges and schools to discuss the revisions. The proposal was presented to Faculty Senate in March and was approved. The new category has been included on the Mason Core website. Proposals coming through for the old categories are being asked to use the new learning outcomes and category designation.

Communication for the new Just Societies Flag & Global Context Category

An announcement for new course proposals was communicated on the Mason Core website. Committee members have also visited department meetings, and spoken with colleagues about the changes which were approved in the 21-22 academic year to inform those about the revised category and the new flag.

Workshops for Just Society & Global Contexts

Six workshops were offered to review the new learning outcomes, provide a guide to the proposal process, and compose a first draft of the proposal to obtain early feedback. There were sixty-five attendees in total. There are 50 faculty members registered for the expanded two-day workshop in June which will help to develop syllabi, provide recommendations for (re)designing assignments and engaging students in conversations to support the Just Societies flag outcomes.

Committee Charge Revisions

The Mason Core Committee collaborated to revise the committee's charge to reflect the changes in staffing for the Mason Core. The new charge added the position of Mason Core director as an ex-officio member. The revisions also reflected the changes the Writing Across the Curriculum Committee were seeking to their own charge – the WAC course proposals will now be reviewed by the Mason Core committee.

New Course Proposal Form

A new course proposal form was created to improve the amount of detail, clarity and expectations of the proposals being submitted to the committee for review. These improvements hope to increase the success of courses being approved by the Mason Core with less revisions needed. The new course proposal form will be put in use for the 2023-2024 academic year.

Assessment of Mason Core Courses/Categories

The first stage of the new assessment cycle for Mason Core courses began during 2022-2023. Courses in the Information Technology and Quantitative Reasoning categories submitted syllabi and student work samples. Revisions to the assessment are in development as a result of this preliminary assessment cycle.

AAC&U Conference Presentation

Bethany Usher, Deb Stroiney and Laura Poms presented a workshop on the Mason Core change management process at the AAC&U General Education, Pedagogy and Assessment conference in New Orleans, LA. The session was well attended with roughly 50 people participating in the workshop.
